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### We will use these skills:

#### **Chronology**

- developing an awareness of the past
- using common words and phrases relating to the passing of time. e.g. day, week, before, after, old, new, past, present, future, first, next, yesterday, today, tomorrow, days of the week in sequence, AD dates (left to right) century,
- knowing where the people and events fit into a chronological framework,

#### **Historical enquiry**

- understanding some of the ways in which we find out about the past
- identifying different ways in which it is represented.

#### **Constructing informed responses**

- asking and answering questions,
- choosing and using parts of stories and other sources to show that we know and understand key features of events.

### We will cover these concepts:

- **similarity and difference** (between ways of life in different periods).
- **change** (within living memory).
- **significance** (significant individuals and significant events).
